

### British Car Week Celebration - May 30:

British Car week takes place the week of May 24<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup>, 1999. After the success of our event in May of 1998, we are pleased to announce a bigger and better version for 1999! The date will be Sunday, May 30<sup>th</sup>, 1999 and the location will be the same as last year: Centennial Park, 288 Beaconsfield Blvd., in Beaconsfield. Take the St. Charles south exit of the 20 and turn right on Beaconsfield Blvd., the field is 1 mile up on your left.

The festivities start at 10 a.m. and finish at 4 p.m. This is a rain or shine event! Cars will be parked by marque; please park on the grass!

A ballot will be provided on arrival. This is for participant's choice in each class, and for best in show. The BiS winner will receive a \$500 gift certificate from the Jaguar Boutique. Winners of the individual classes will receive a certificate and a scale model British car courtesy of Decarie Motors. Decarie will also try to have on display new

Jaguars, Aston Martins and even a Bentley.

The BCW event is raising money for the Montreal Breast Cancer Foundation, so donations are encouraged.

This will be the largest gathering of British cars in the Montreal area in 1999. You cannot afford to miss it!

Some of the highlights of the Show are: 20,000 square feet of floor space; cars ranging from the period 1946 - 1970; free entrance to the show with your Ex admission; two days of viewing followed by auction on 3<sup>rd</sup> day, etc. For people interested in selling their car, the Ex charges a flat \$150 fee per car. This is unlike typical auctions where the fee is a fixed % of the price reached. On the other hand, the fee is charged whether the car sells or if it fails to meet any pre-set reserve price. If you like to live dangerously, go for it! Despite Lori's attempts to enter one of my cars in the auction at the meeting that night, I'll settle for merely spectating this time around! They are hoping to get their maximum of 76 cars available for auction at the show. There's no telling what may be up for grabs at this point, so remember to bring your chequebook.

### New Event from The Roadster Factory:

I have also just learned of a new event from the Roadster Factory in Pennsylvania – their Spring Drive-in, for Saturday, June 5. This was advertised in their Spring Specials flyer, so it is not widely known. It does not appear on their web site, to my knowledge.

The cost of this event is a token \$10 per British car, or \$10 per person otherwise. For that fee, there is the following: free camping on the grounds of TRF (although there are only temporary toilet and shower facilities available); lunch (submarines, pop & ice cream) and dinner (burgers & dogs, beans and potato salad); a flea market (you can bring your own items to sell also); a tune-up & fix-up clinic; mountain tours; parts discounts (20% for under \$1,000, 25% over \$1,000). You can pre-register (for which you get a free event t-shirt) by fax, phone or mail. If you can't attend, the shirt will be shipped to you.

## Oil Filter Update, Part 2 – the TR3A:

While in Belleville for Mother's Day, I paid a visit to what is becoming my favourite store, TSC (I don't believe they are in the Ottawa area yet). I did a visual comparison with the Unipart TR3A oil filter I had, and found a close match with a Fram unit on their shelf. A check in the big catalogue confirmed it – the replacement for the Unipart GFE104 is the Fram CH820PL. As with the TR6 filter CH837PL I mentioned last month, there were plenty of these 'tractor' filters in stock!

If anyone using other 'GFE' filters wishes me to cross-reference for their cars, just let me know the number and I can check my next time home.


