### OVTC Christmas Party

Happy New Year members. This is our first Newsletter since our November 27th meeting. Our regular December meeting was replaced by our traditional OVTC Christmas Party held, again, at Jane and Juliano Benco's home on December 16th. There was a good turn out for this event and thanks to all those who attended. Everyone brought a special food dish and, as usual, a good time was had by one and all. Thanks again this year to Jane and Juliano for offering their hospitality and beautiful home to stage this event.

### Highlights of January 23, 1991 Meeting

The first meeting of 1991 was held on Wednesday evening, January 23rd, at the Woodvale/Manordale Community Centre in Nepean. Our guest speaker was Terry Dale who owns and operates "The Old Car Factory" at 24 Bentley Avenue in Nepean, one of the region's most reputable sources for parts and service on cars of the '50s and '60s, especially British sports cars. Approximately 16 OVTC members were present for the meeting.

### SU/Stromberg Carbs

Terry Dale gave an excellent presentation on the operation and servicing of SU (simply useless) and Stromberg Carbs. Terry reviewed the purpose and function of these carbs, how to tune and maintain them and the marvels of a Triumph four-stroke engine; i.e., the "suck, squeeze, pop, bluey" phenomenon. Here are some of the highlights of Terry's presentation:

- Carburator main purpose is to vapourize liquid fuel, mix it with the proper proportion of air so it can be of a right mixture to enable combustion in the engine (i.e., liquid fuel does not ignite without air).
- Tail pipe deposits black smoke or residue means unburned gas. Blue smoke means unburned oil, white smoke or residue means unburned water vapour. Ideal residue on tail pipes is a light grey or light brown coloured residue.
- SU and stromberg carbs have a piston in the dashpot that rises from the vacuum created in the engine. A needle is attached to the bottom of the SU piston and when it lifts, the pin rises, thus allowing the gas vapour mixture into the engine.
- Rate of rise of piston is controlled by the damper oil at the top of the carb.
- Damper oil in warm weather use thicker oil, in colder weather use lighter-weight oil. Generally, use the same oil in the damper as you use in the engine. Check the oil damper level every week. Keep oil level topped up to bottom of threads in Stromberg carbs.

- Take care in cleaning inside of dashpots (SUs) if disassembling carbs. Use solvents only, don't use abrasive products as this will destroy the seal between the inside wall of the dashpot and the outside surface of the piston. With the Stromberg carbs, take care in not tearing the rubber diaphram on the inside of the mechanism.
- Terry explained some tuning tips that maybe we could get him to demonstrate at an outdoor tune-up clinic some time this spring or summer.

Our President gave a brief update on the latest developments in our progress to jointly sponsor the 1991 Canadian Classic set for August 1-3, 1991, here in Ottawa.


