Highlights of February 27th, 1991, Meeting

The February meeting of the OVTC was held on Wednesday evening, February 27th, at the Woodvale/Manordale Community Centre in Nepean. Approximately 22 members were present, which is about our average turn out. Given our total membership of 46, this represents about a 50% turn-out rate which, by comparison to the attendance record of other similar car clubs, is an impressive figure.

Main Event

Although we had hoped to get a VCR tape of the Vintage Triumph Register Convention from Boulder, Colorado, last summer, the tape never arrived from our TTC colleagues, therefore, we had to scratch together a presentation of 35 mm slides from our President, Malcolm Brown, and yours truly (Barry Edgington) on various sports car events.

Nostalgia ran rampant as we viewed slides I had taken during my misguided youth—such events as the 1963 Sebring race in Florida (yes, folks, that was Phil Hill in his red Ferrari), a 1964 Virginia International Raceway (VIR) event, a North Carolina 1965 Dragstrip event featuring a very young Richard Petty in his baby blue Plymouth Barracuda, plus some assorted slides of my 1965 Austin-Healey 3000 MK III and my current 1959 TR-3A-early restoration attempts. Malcolm also showed some slides of his 1974 TR-6 restoration, as well as some shots of a TR-6 run last summer.

It was a fun time and confirmed for all present that British sports cars, indeed, have sumptuous and curvilinear lines. Hang on guys, spring is just around the corner.

Capital Fun in '91 - Canadian Classic Update

Malcolm handed out the 6th Canadian Classic Registration brochure that he has single-hand

edly designed and produced. The brochure is included in this Newsletter so get your early registration fees in OVTC members--it's going to be a great event. Super job again, Malcolm.

On February 10th, members of your Executive Committee went to Kingston, Ontario, to meet with representatives of the Toronto Triumph Club and the Boot 'n Bonnet Club. Present from OVTC were Malcolm Brown, Larry Henderson, Brian Mills, Clive Law, Juliano Benco, Jeff Threader and Barry Edgington. From TTC were Glen Donaldson (TTC's new President), Bill Grey (TTC's Past-President and founder), Kevin McGibbon, Sandy McCrea amd Charlie Conquergood (organizer of last year's 5th Annual Canadian Classic in Peterborough, Ontario). From B 'n B were Linda and Brian Thomas, well known for their efforts in organizing the very successful Classic in Kingston two years ago.

OVTC handed out a multi-page Issues/Presentation Paper for cosponsoring the Classic in Ottawa this summer and this was discussed over lunch at the Holiday Inn in Kingston. Brian Mills presented his graphic layout plans for staging the Concours event on Victoria Island and left a specially prepared design/photo display board with the TTC members present.

Malcolm led the discussion of issues from OVTC's point of view and considerable progress was made. A division of responsibilities between what OVTC and TTC would perform was clarified and decided upon (see Newsletter No. 19). The Schedule of Events was confirmed and registration/financial details were discussed at length. Seed money has been obtained from TTC and Malcolm has placed deposits on both the Ottawa River Boat Cruise and the use of double-decker buses.

The overall planning for this event is definitely on schedule and the details of planning for the specific events only remain to be worked out. In this regard, we'd like to devote some time at each of our upcoming regular OVTC meetings to have status reports from our various Organizing Committees to keep everyone abreast of our progress. 


