HONEY, THERE'S SOMETHING I HAVE TO TELL YOU...

Many of us know the delicate balance involved in attending to our automotive passion and all our other priorities and responsibilities. Those of us who are married have the further task of doing so at the discretion of our 'better halves'. I had bought my TR6 at the age of 19 when these outside concerns were still far off. Sadly, Ron had passed away from a heart attack at an early age while working abroad. Mrs. Audette told Jane that after first seeing whether either of their two university-age children wanted Ron's car, she wished to have it sold via the OVTC. Jane had called me with Mrs. Audette's number to obtain the details for the newsletter. This is where the 'balance' above becomes so important!

I called and spoke to Mrs. Audette. Ron had owned a 1958 TR3A, which he had bought in the mid-1980's from what she believed to be the original owner. The

car had wire wheels, overdrive, and three tops, including the factory metal hardtop. I think I started to twitch! The car was still in winter storage beside the house, but Harris & Peter Popplewell would soon be taking the car off its stands and readying it for summer (the Audette's & Popplewell's have been friends for several years). I could have a look at it then.

When I told this to Lori, she started to get that spousal look of pain whenever a TR nut starts to mention a car for sale! She said to go have a look at the car 'if you must'. When I went to see the car, I knew that was it. The car is black, with black interior & hard top, and with a white soft top and tonneau. If that wasn't enough, driving the car did the rest. I was hooked! Now I had to come up with a 'sales pitch' to Lori. One slight complication in all of this: we had just bought another car (a Dodge Intrepid) a couple of weeks before, so Lori said 'You can buy the car if you want it, but the TR6 has to go'. Ouch! Little things like garage space for the Dodge next winter were uppermost in Lori's mind, not to mention the bathroom reno. Me? I was seeing things from a TR perspective, of course. I knew there wasn't much time to act, as a business colleague of Jane's had looked at the car also. I had been to see & drive the car on the Saturday, and this person saw the car on Sunday. This was now Monday, the day of the April meeting. I had to act fast - I called Mrs. Audette at her office Monday morning, expecting her to say the other person had bought the car the day before, on sight. When she said he hadn't and that the first one to meet her price would take the car, I heard a voice that sounded like mine say "I'll take it".

So there I was, the owner of two Triumph sports cars – with a wife and a bathroom renovation in the wings! What

have I done?! Now comes the delicate matter of explaining to Lori that the renovation can still happen, and I'll clean up the garage & sell off the remainder of the TR6 parts to offset the price of the TR3A. No problem, right? I get home from work, and it turns out that Lori had not had the best of days. This wasn't going to be easy! I was trying to find a way to break it to her, and knowing that Jane Benco was going to be there that night (by which time she may have heard from her friend that I had bought the car) meant I had to do it before the meeting.
