# Tech stuff Ouestion:

I am unable to shift my car into gear while it is running. I checked the master cylinder and it was empty except for some black sludge. What is this sludge? And what should I do first? How do I clean this stuff out and how do I check to see if it is anywhere else? Also, I have been unable to shift the car into reverse at all. Is reverse out or do I need to put some fluid in it for it to work.

The black sludge is rubber from the seals in the clutch system. With age they start breaking down (and wearing in the cylinders), hence the black sludge.

#### Answers:

The sludge is just that...sludge.

If the master is dry then fluid is leaking from the seals. Both the slave and the master are prone to leaking with age. So if you rebuild one you're better off doing both at the same time.

I would suggest, for starters, you go out and buy a couple bottles of cheap brake fluid. Find someone to sit in the car and pump the brake pedal for you. Tell them to bring a book to read because it sounds like your going to be at it for a while. Be advised, this is not a fix. Just a place to get you started in the troubleshooting process. Pick any wheel, jack up the car and put it on a secure jack stand. Go underneath and try to get the bleeder valve opened up. I suspect it will be quite rusted. If you can find a piece of old 1/4" rubber tubing and an old coffee can it will make it a lot easier. Slide the tubing over the bleeder and put the other end in the coffee can. Fill the reservoir with brake fluid. (you might want to remove and clean the reservoir first, but you will be cleaning it again later, too)

#### NOW START PUMPING THAT PEDAL AND KEEP THE TANK FILLED UP!!! HAVE FUN!!

Do it on all 4 wheels. You'll have to do it a couple times to each wheel until the fluid comes out perfectly clean. Don't worry too much about getting air in the system, right now your main goal is to get the lines and cylinders cleaned out and exercised a little.

Now, you can at least start to troubleshoot the system and decide what is working and what needs repair. Also, you can start researching the type of fluid you want to use for the final flushing and bleeding. There are several different types and a lot more opinions on which to use.

Ideally you should either rebuild or replace the clutch slave and master. You should probably remove the master cylinder and disassemble it. Then take a good look inside the cylinder to see if there is any pitting. If it is smooth, you can simply clean it up and replace the rubber parts. If it is lightly pitted, you can probably get away with honing it before replacing the rubber parts. I know that the book advises against honing but I have done it to numerous clutch and brake cylinders and have had good success.

After that, all you have to do is purge the rest of the system and check the slave cylinder to make sure it is still operable. Then refill and bleed the system.
