the events in this issue of your news letter. So, get your calendars out and mark the spot with an X, better still, get those Triumphs polished up and

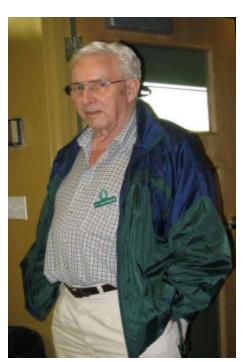
join the fun.

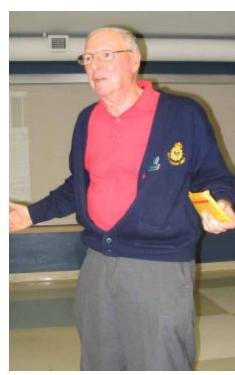

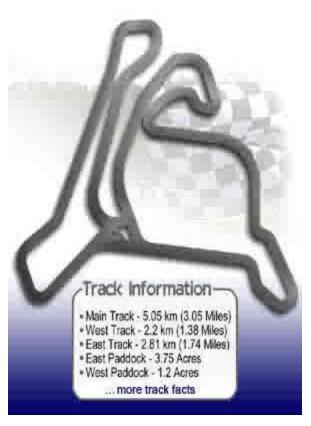

Calabogie Motorsport up-dates

On October 17, 2005 the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing approved the required Amendment allowing Calabogie Motorsports Park to exist in the Official Plan for the County of Renfrew. This decision was based on work done at the Municipal and County levels of government, and review by other respective Provincial agencies. This is the final approval required for CMP. Along with the Municipal re-zoning amendment of October 12, 2004, this decision has been appealed to the Ontario Municipal Board, a process that should be concluded over the Winter season, and be handled concurrently with the 2004 zoning appeal.

Calabogie MotorSports will not be taking bookings for the 2006 season at this time. Bookings will be taken this Spring, once the appeals process has been cleared, and a firm paving date has been confirmed. Preference will be given to those that had taken tentative bookings for the 2005 season, and a system for bookings will be sent out in early Spring to all groups and individuals that have made inquiries over the last 24 months. Again , the track will be rented at an introductory rate for the shortened season, and as an incentive to prospective clients, passes for CMP's exclusive pre-opening test weekend will accompany each rental for the 2006 season. VTR data base

Vintage Triumph Register (VTR) announces the public launch of a Wiki-type database called WikiVTR with open access to all Triumph enthusiasts, be they members of VTR or not. VTR, in an effort to provide further support for Triumph enthusiasts worldwide, has established and is hosting this Wiki environment devoted entirely to Triumphs using a Creative Commons license that will make it freely available to all.

If you are unfamiliar with what a Wiki environment is, here is a description: "Wiki is server software that allows users to freely create and edit Web page content using any Web browser. Wiki supports hyperlinks and has a simple text syntax for creating new pages and cross-links between internal pages on the fly. Wiki is unusual among group communication mechanisms in that it allows the organization of contributions to be edited in addition to the content itself. Like many simple concepts, "open editing" has some profound and subtle effects on Wiki usage. Allowing everyday users to create and edit any page in a Web site is exciting in that it encourages democratic use of the Web and promotes content composition by non-technical users."

The intention of WikiVTR is to compliment the VTR Maintenance Handbook and, as of today, that information is once again freely available to all. Hopefully, this action will encourage many more to contribute to WikiVTR with the goal that it will become a valuable source of knowledge for all in our hobby.

There surely will be some growing pains associated with WikiVTR since it is based on the model of self-policing. With the exception of the Table of Contents page for each Triumph vehicle type, every page is editable. The Wiki concept has proven successful because anyone may create and/or edit any page. In general, the higher the number of contributors (or editors), the more useful and accurate a Wiki's content becomes.

Entry to WikiVTR is made via the RESOURCES tab on the VTR home page. Alternatively you can click on this direct link: http://www.vtr.org/disclaimer/. With either method, you will need to read and agree to a disclaimer to proceed. With your help, WikiVTR will become a useful resource to everyone who enjoys vintage Triumph automobiles.

Twenty years ago, shortly after getting married, Sue and I sold the first house we ever bought, located in Raleigh, North Carolina. Sue had been offered a job transfer to the UK, partially because she was married to me, a UK citizen, and immigration was therefore easier, but mostly because she was the right person for the job. We've kept in touch with old friends in the Raleigh area, but have only visited the area once since, about 16 years ago. As Sue and I met because we were both members of the Tarheel Sports Car Club, an affiliate of the SCCA, we met most of our friends through the club too.

This year, we decided we owed it to all our friends in North Carolina to visit them. The 14-hour drive at the beginning of March Break didn't seem so bad. The first family we were going to stay with was our friend Scott. He was single when we left, but now has a family, along with a TR3, an MGB and a Miata. The MGB came off worse in a recent minor accident and was in storage, but as the weather was sunny and 28 degrees, we went for a drive in the TR3 and the Miata. It was interesting to compare Scott's TR3 to ours; so many differences. What I didn't like was that it was much quieter..... We stayed with Scott, Angela and their two boys for two nights/3 days and had a great time. We even took Jason out to experience a good ol' southern barbecue and fried chicken meal, complete with collards and Brunswick Stew.

After a couple of days of motoring around in the TR3, I thought things couldn't get much better. We moved on to stay with the second family that we have kept in touch with. Nick England and Mary Whitton live in Chapel Hill, NC, just a few miles down the road. I had contacted Nick a few weeks prior to our departure and said "by the way, Nick, do you still have the two Minis, the E-Type, the two Alfa Montreals, the Porsche 356 Cabriolet and the Ferrari Testarossa?" He replied "I sold all the nice cars and now the only car I have to keep me satisfied is the 1966 Lamborghini Miura". Life's tough, isn't it? "Oh", he went on to say, "and Mary still has the Porsche 356 Cabriolet, the Porsche 912, the two Ferrari Mondiales and we each have a vintage racer branded as a Beach; only 13 produced". Yes, these are car people. The day after we

Nick took Jason out for a ride in the Lamborghini Miura and, as Jason put it, "he really stretched its legs". Apparently, Nick thought it was only running on 9 or 10 cylinders, so he was trying to clear out the cobwebs. Afterwards, Sue and Mary took one of the two Ferrari Mondiales out for a drive and then I went out for a drive with Nick in the Porsche 356 Cabriolet. We remember Nick and Mary bringing this car to our wedding, so it was special to see it again.

As if all this wasn't enough, the next day Nick and Mary invited us to go and see their two Beach vintage racers. Some years ago, Nick and Mary invested some money into a fledgling exotic car repair/vintage racer preparation business, run by another mutual friend whom we also met through the Tarheel Sports Car Club. The business is now called Krause and England (see www.krauseandengland.com). You walk in the front door and are immediately greeted by the showroom, filled with a beautiful, exotic Siata and an Abarth 750 Spider, both prepared for vintage racing. Behind this; the shop. This was filled with a plethora of Alfa Romeos, most in for engine swaps, servicing, preparation for the next race, etc. There was a recent Ferrari cabriolet in for a service and some repair, a 1960's Ferrari 330GT Mk.1 for some fettling, an original Formula 2 Lotus racecar and many others. One Alfa, a Giulietta Spider, had started off as a "Normale" model and was being upgraded to a "Veloce", the high performance version. Peter prefers to refer to this version as the "Abnormale". Some think it's just a question of a pair of Webers, but the engine has to be lifted and tilted, with different mounts, in order for the Webers to clear the inner fender.

Then there was Nick and Mary's Beach. The car is totally disassembled and considerable discussion went on regarding how the tub was going to be welded to incorporate the roll cage. While this was going on, we were given a tour of "the transporter". This is a large, enclosed racecar transporter towed by a semi, holding at least 8 cars. In it were Nick and Mary's other Beach, in which Nick has competed very successfully, along with several Alfas and Fiats. Look out for the Krause and England team at Mosport this year; they're coming!

In the back room of this very special business, we explored "The Library", a fabulous collection of old magazines, books and manuals, all related to the various exotica around which the business revolves.

We were driving at a good pace in order to make the first ferry and, although we had plenty of time, it was nevertheless frustrating to catch up with a long line of cars, all driving close to each other and very slowly. MG Rover's famous V8 petrol engine, over 40 years in production, lives on

MG Rover's famous V8 petrol engine, over 40 years in production, lives on even though its original maker is history and it has been all but superseded in the Range Rover and Land Rover model lines.

UK West Country-based MCT, an engineering and manufacturing specialist, has won a contract from Ford-owned Land Rover to continue production of original equipment aftermarket engines and manufacture has relocated from Land Rover's Solihull home, near Birmingham, to MCT's plant in seaside Weston Super Mare, Somerset.

Besides engine production, MCT also sources components and sub-assemblies and tests and ships completed engines.

In displacements from 3.5 to 4.6 litres, the engine, originally designed by General Motors in the US, has powered the Land Rover Defender,

Discovery and Range Rover, Rover P5B, P6 and SD1, the MGB GT, Triumph's TR8 and various Morgans and TVRs. A variant was also used in the short-lived Australian-made Leyland P76 large car in the mid-70s.

MCT claims the simple, 16-valve, OHV V8 is the standard British engine for all hot rod use and special versions have powered the Formula 1 winning Brabham team. Just-auto has also seen it in speedboats.

The contract is worth GBP25m over the next five years and over 70% of engines made will be exported.

Originally established as a powertrain remanufacturer, MCT has now expanded into what it calls "life cycle management" – new build low volume development and introduction, medium volume series production, low volume model run-out, and aftermarket.

Current customers include Ford, Land Rover, General Motors, Mitsubishi, Isuzu, Subaru, Caterham Cars and van maker LDV.
