A Triumphant Holiday By Martin Burtt

I recently spent a week's vacation in England and had the chance to visit a number of Triumph sites of interest. My first stop, straight off the plane, was Moss Europe's London outlet (http://www.moss-europe.co.uk). Located only 5 miles from the airport and easy to find, I picked up a number of parts that I've been meaning to get for some time. I also got the Moss Europe TR6 catalogue which is 330 pages compared to the 80 page North American version. There's lots of additional information on performance and tuning and almost every page has titbits of information not found in the NA catalogue. I also spotted my first Triumph, a purple(?!?) TR6, in the Moss parking lot.

My next Triumph activity was a visit to Revington TR in Somerset (http://www.revingtontr.com/). After reading about Revington TR in many magazines and often drooling over the performance parts on their website, I was very excited as I approached the village of Middlezoy where Revington are located. Unfortunately I'd forgotten my map next to the computer back home in Canada, but I figured that it wouldn't be too tough to find somewhere as famous as Revington in a small Somerset village. So I turned off the main road into the town and drove around looking for them, Nothing, so out to the main road in case it was just out of the village. Still nothing. Another drive around the village turned up no sign so I stopped in the post office and was given directions. At the far end of town was a white farm house I'd driven by on my first pass with a small hand painted sign on the front: "Home Farm". Not a Triumph in sight, but I drove around back and found the home of Revington TR. Located in a number of former farm outbuildings, Revington is very much a "cottage-industry". I went in the main office and was cheerfully shown around by Martin of Revington TR.

The tour started with one of the warehouses, storing a multitude of small parts accumulated over the vears. When I explained I was rebuilding my rear suspension and drive train, Martin showed me a set of their improved rollingspline drive shafts. Unfortunately, at £170 a side (\$350), they'll have to wait until another trip. The tour continued with a couple of workshops where TR were rebuilding a TR3 frame and performing maintenance on a TR6 and TR3. They are also the UK of supplier Super Pro polyurethane bushings from and have a Australia large warehouse for various applications. The body shop was



next where several TR4s and TR3s were in various stages of restoration and paint. In the yard between the buildings were several very interesting cars including a Triumph Italia, Revington's works TR4 rally car 6CV and the matching powder-blue Atlas competition van. Back in the office, Martin showed me a model of their "coil-over" rear tube shock conversion while finding a few parts for me to bring home.

While in England I stay with an uncle who lives in the New Forest on the south coast between Southampton and Bournemouth. Three miles from his house is the town of Beaulieu. Beaulieu is home to the National Motor Museum (http://www.beaulieu.co.uk/motormuseum/) and a small garage selling classic British cars. I visited the museum on my last trip so it wasn't on the agenda this time, but I did stop by the Beaulieu Garage (http://www.beaulieugarage.co.uk/). The garage always has a fabulous collection of cars on display and this time was no exception. In addition to some immaculate E-types, Mk2's, Austin Healey's and MGAs were a couple of TR6's and a TR4. All were in pristine condition. The sixes were listed at £15,000 and the TR4 was £17,000!



and rushed off to get an MOT on one of the cars.

Southern Triumph Services, in Bournemouth, Dorset was next on the agenda (http://www.southerntriumph.co.uk/). I've always noticed their ad in various car magazines as they are located in the neighbourhood where my father grew up. I just didn't realize until I got there that the garage is only half a block from the house my father lived in! Located down a back alley in a quiet residential area, the garage is my stereotypical specialist car garage. The street outside was lined with various Triumphs, including Stags, Heralds, and other Triumphs seldom seen on these shores. Parked halfway along the alley was a GT6. The garage is a collection of interconnected buildings, crammed full of cars in various stages of repair, piles and piles of parts and tools. I was greeted in the office by Rachel, and after explaining that I just wanted to have a look around, she introduced me to owner Mark Swingler

Mark's knowledge of Triumphs is encyclopaedic and his enthusiasm contagious. Showing me around the garage we quickly found ourselves beside the MkI GT6 that he'd been working on when I arrived. The restoration of the car is being featured in Retro Cars magazine with the goal of running it in the 2007 Classic Monte Carlo Rally. After a long chat about all things Triumph we stopped back in the office where Mark grabbed a piece of paper and jotted down a list of modifications to make when I get around to rebuilding my engine, including cam specs, carb needle sizes and installation

instructions. On the back of the paper, he scribbled a crash course in balancing the bottom end of the engine with a detailed explanation of where to shave weight from the con rods. I honestly had to drag myself away and can't wait to see how the restoration is coming along in the next issue of Retro Cars.

(This is the part of the story where my wife thinks I should mention that while I spent my hour and a half in the garage, I'd left her sitting in the car. In my defence, she did have a book to read and I really didn't notice the time passing that quickly. I probably would have been more quickly forgiven if I hadn't unthinkingly pressed the key fob as I left the car, locking her in and arming the alarm. After an hour, it became quite warm in the



car, and unable to open the doors because of the alarm, my 7 month pregnant wife was wishing it didn't have electric windows and that she hadn't married such a thoughtless man. Fortunately, I have the world's most tolerant wife and I have since been forgiven. I think the new sun visor for the passenger side of the car helped).

I had hoped to finish my vacation with a visit to CTM Engineering (http://www.ctmengineering.co.uk), manufacturer of new Triumph frames, but again the forgotten map back home was my downfall and despite being within a few miles I didn't have time to find them. Oh well, I need somewhere to visit next trip, along with the Beaulieu Auto jumble, Brooklands, the Goodwood Revival, Heritage Motor Centre.......

Thanks again to Martin at Revington TR and Mark and Rachel at Southern Triumph Services for their time in showing me around.
