

On Dec 20th 1971 the Triumph Motor Company Limited acknowledged in a letter to a Mrs Doris H Noonan receipt of an order and deposit of 100 pounds for the purchase of a Triumph Spitfire Sports Car for delivery through Martin Motors Limited of London and eventual export to Canada. A copy of the order form was enclosed. The total purchase price was 876 pounds. On Jan 3rd 1972, at Martin Motors, the car was delivered to Mrs Noonan. Six months later, Mr Noonan was transferred from London to Singapore instead of back home to Winnipeg. Mrs Noonan and the children stayed behind three years while the children finished school. During this time Mrs Noonan drove the car before it was shipped in 1975 to Winnipeg where it was warehoused in dry storage along with the rest of

the household items. At that time, the family joined Mr Noonan in Singapore. In October of 1982 the Noonans moved back to the Toronto area. The car was removed from storage, serviced and shipped out East. It was serviced once in Winnipeg and again in Islington. Between servicing 100 more miles were put on the car and then it was stored in a dry garage at the Noonan's home in Creemore. The car was driven 600 miles in 11 years until it was purchased by a Mr Nigel Roberts in 2004. Over the next four years the car was upgraded with many performance parts. Most recently the car won first place in its category at the 25th Annual, 2008 British Car Day car show at Bronte Provincial Park. The car was purchased shortly after in Sept 2008 from Mr Roberts. Mr Patrick Noonan who now lives in Etobicoke was contacted shortly after the purchase of the car. He is looking forward to seeing recent pictures.

All original documentation to confirm authenticity, including the purchase order, bill of sale, import/export documents, sales brochures, service records, the original key fob, and receipts for all upgrades. The car remains original in its interior, glass, chrome, hard and soft top, and paint.

Tiptoe Through The Tulips – A Genteel Rally Presented by the Ottawa Jaguar Club

McDonalds's Corners, Lavant, Elphin, Ardoch, Coxvale, Ompah these are just a few of the places we went through on the "Genteel Rally" presented by the Ottawa Jaguar Club on Sunday, October 5th. Six Jaguars, Don LeBlanc with wife Janet in their Spitfire, Brian and I in the TR4A, Wayne Mercer in his bright yellow Miata and a Camero met in the parking lot of the Carleton Place Canadian Tire. Wilf Haasper, driving his smart little red GT6 was there to see us off.

After registration and instructions on how to read the route book the first car was off at 10:00:30. Brian and I were sent off at 10:04:30 and just 9.7 miles down the road missed the first turn, a left hander to Clayton. Brian continually reminds me that this is where we lost 16 minutes and gained 16 points. Since we had opted to do the rally as a drive and not bother with the timing I wasn't concerned, I was just glad that we recognized our mistake quickly and managed to turn around and get back on track. For the next hour and a half we enjoyed the colour of the fall leaves as we made our way over 50 miles of the paved roads between Carleton Place and Perth north of highway # 7. By 11:30 we were turning into the parking lot of Fiddleheads Restaurant in Perth. In the courtyard the sun felt warm and jackets were shed as we checked in with the control car. Cars were admired, stories told and 26 hungry people made their way into the old mill for a tasty lunch.

At precisely 1:00:30 the first car, an XKE was sent out on the afternoon portion of the rally. We were off to play in North Frontenac, Land O' Lakes and the Lanark Highlands. Up the 511, down the 509, roads meant to be driven by these little British cars. Along the route there were 10 check points and 8 questions to be answered. We missed the answer to one of the questions early on, but managed to pick it up later as we retraced the same road in the opposite direction. What luck!

About 4:30 we pulled into the parking lot of the Leatherworks Pub in Carleton Place. Once again we had to check in at a control car and hand in our time card and answer sheet. Everyone retired to the warmth of the Pub to await the results. The warmth was welcomed as Don, Janet, Brian and I had completed the entire rally with tops down. At the beginning of the rally one of the Jags had its top down, but by lunch it was up. It got a little chilly in the highlands especially when the sun hid behind the clouds, but dressed in layers and feeling a little like the Michelin Man we were comfortable.

The party continued in the pub where there were beers all round and some ordered dinner. We were warmly received by the Jaguar Club and made to feel welcome. Lots of stories were told, lots of laughter was heard. Finally the results were in. A Jaguar had come in first with 18 points. The two Triumphs had tied for second place with 24 points each thus taking home over half of the hardware for the OVTC. Fourth place went to the Camero with 28 points. Wayne Mercer, of the OVTC, wore the hats of both driver and navigator and should get a prize for the most perfect sections. He managed to get through three of four sections without gaining a point, the only person to do so, but sadly missed a check point which dropped him to seventh.

We would like to thank the Ottawa Jaguar Club for inviting the Ottawa Valley Triumph Club to join them for a very enjoyable day. Many thanks to Marc and Sheila Chappell and Guy and Christine Goodman for all the time and hard work they put in to make the rally such a great success. From the Route Book to those manning the control cars every thing was very professional. Well done!
