The room rate is \$169 plus tax, but there is a 5% discount if you are a CAA member. They will hold our block of rooms until May 31 so you need to move quickly to confirm your spot. After that it will be best effort to get a reservation there and I have no idea what the rates will be. Although we don't end up spending a lot of time at the hotel usually, this hotel does have an indoor pool, which might be kind of nice to relax in at the end of the day. Canadian Classic 2011

It's been 15 years since the Canadian Classic was last held in the Nation's Capital. This year, the Toronto Triumph Club and the Ottawa Valley Triumph Club are teaming up to present you with a **Capital Classic**. We hope that a lot of OVTC members will take this opportunity to participate and meet our southern Ontario Triumph cousins.

Things officially get underway Friday afternoon, but there is an optional golf tournament Friday. The eQuinelle Golf Club (http://www.equinellegolf.ca/) is the Region's newest championship golfing experience, located just south of the city in Kemptville, ON. OVTC members can golf with those arriving early from Toronto.

Registration will get underway at the Travelodge Hotel Ottawa Friday afternoon. The Travelodge is the host hotel and starting point for our weekend events. Classic participants will be picked up by double decker bus from the hotel at 6pm for a sightseeing tour of Ottawa landmarks. We'll be stopping at a downtown pub to eat and socialize, before returning by bus to the hotel.

On Saturday morning we'll be holding the traditional Canadian Classic Car Show in conjunction with the All British Car Day (www.britishcarday.ca) on the shore of the Ottawa River in Britannia Park. British cars of every marquee and vintage will be on display in this scenic setting. Classic participants will be parked in a designated area, and a BBQ lunch will be served.

After lunch, Classic participants will leave for a driving tour west of Ottawa. This short drive will offer a chance to visit a few local sites, including the Deifenbunker (http://www.diefenbunker.ca). Built to protect the government from nuclear attack, this once-secret bunker is now a museum and National Historic Site of Canada. We'll get back to the hotel with time to freshen up before the evening Awards Banquet.

We understand that many of those returning to Toronto will be leaving early for the Brits in the Park show in Lindsay. Those wishing to make a leisurely return home are invited to join us for a drive southwest of Ottawa.

The registration fee includes the Friday bus tour and meal, ABCD entry including lunch, museum entry and Saturday banquet dinner with awards and prizes. A registration form can be found on the next page.

OVTC LONG DISTANCE CHALLENGE

The purpose of the event is to encourage OVTC drivers to drive their Triumph as much as possible. To help and encourage all participants, the participation to this challenge is also compliant with the British Car Council Incorporated "Long Distance Award". The logistics, rules and regulations are as follows:

- 1. Vehicles participating must NOT be "daily drivers" (i.e.: only classic cars used for driving for events and pleasure during the season are eligible)
- 2. Contest timing will be April 1st through October 31st, 2011.
- 3. The event will be open to all OVTC members. OVTC is a member of BCCI so mileage also counts for the BCCI Distance Award.
- 4. Each participating automobile will have the odometer read by a member of their club executive at the start and end of the contest.
- 5. Club executives will be responsible for recording the starting and the ending odometer reading on the attached form.
- 6. Any defective odometer instruments are the responsibility of the owner to repair (no verbal estimates of distance will be accepted)
- 7. A dash plaque or other prize will be awarded by the OVTC to the top three drivers at the end of the season.
- 8. A distance achievement certificate will be awarded by the OVTC to all club members who successfully complete more than 2000 miles within the contest period.

Let's get out there and drive those Triumphs! Remember to have fun and drive safely.




OVTC MEMBERSHIP
