

Errata in June Issue:

I am looking for a suitable 2 Km course that would be relatively traffic—free in a nice location... suggestions are welcome.

This would allow others in the club to read about our own impressions of the fine cars in the Triumph marque. Please consider running for office, or at the very least attend the September meeting and vote.


Stowe Notes - Clive Law
